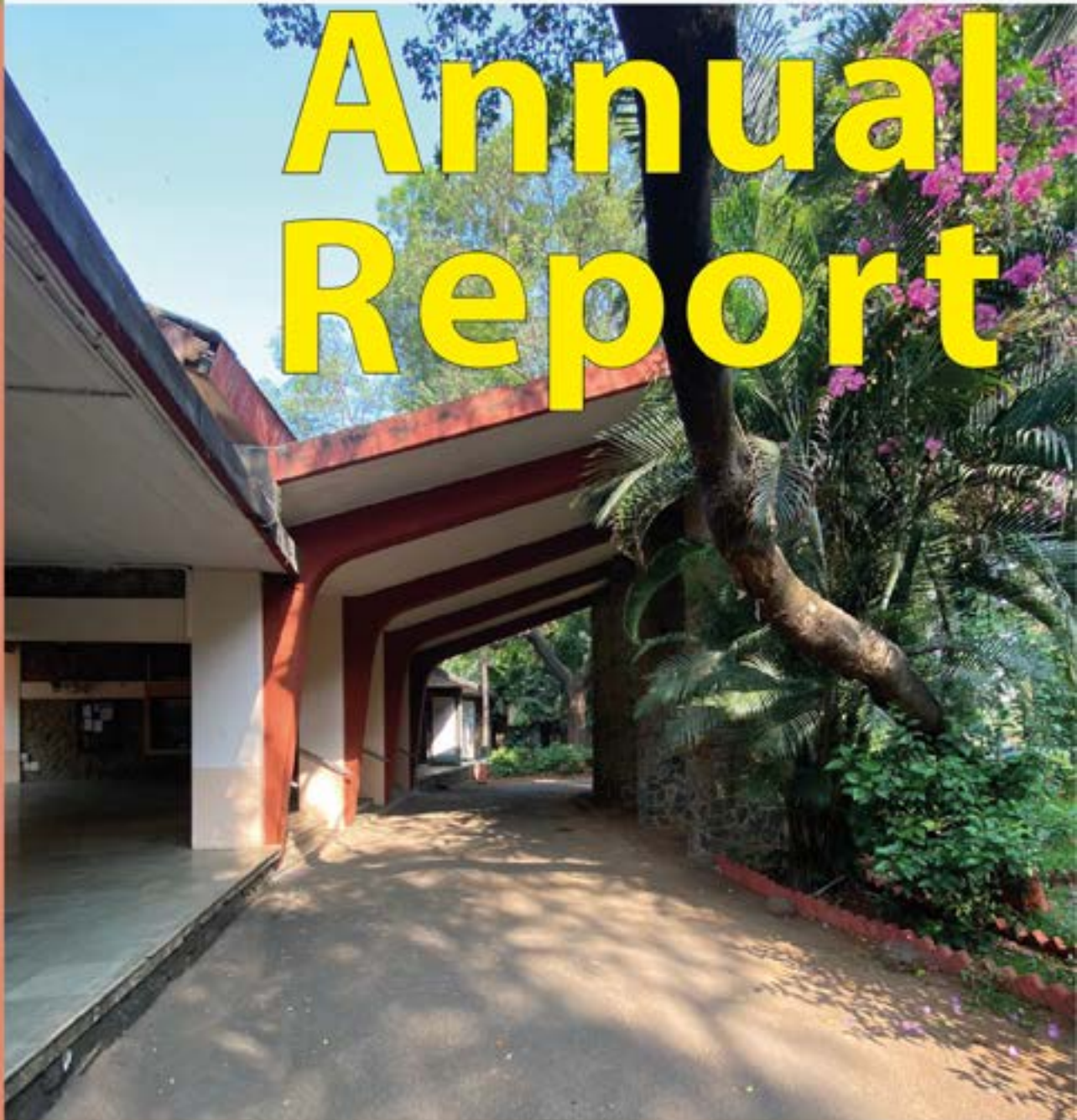

DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2020-2021

**Shri S. Ramadorai, Chairman, Governing Board; our esteemed Chief Guest for today's Convocation
Dr. K. Kasturirangan; Members of the Academic Council and of the Governing Board; students, staff and
faculty; parents of the graduating students, and all other guests connecting with us virtually:**

I welcome you all to the 81st Convocation of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS). As the Director of TISS, it is my privilege and honour to present before you the Institute's Annual Report for the year 2020-2021.

Almost 20 months since the COVID-19 pandemic began, we continue to be challenged by it and consequently, yet again the Annual Convocation, the much awaited event for graduating students, is being hosted virtually. The silver lining is that the pandemic failed to derail our academic journey.

ACADEMIC CONTINUITY DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Like any other educational institution, TISS too was impacted by the situation that emerged out of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Institute had to suddenly close its operations of physical classes and other direct engagement with students from 22 March 2020. However, faculty members and the IT team worked together and developed a plan for an IT-enabled delivery and management of academic functions. A TISS Online Learning (TISSOL) platform was created to facilitate transaction of online teaching integrated with Zoom application for synchronous classes and Turnitin plagiarism check for academic submissions. Several rounds of trainings were provided to faculty members and administrative staff to familiarise them with TISSOL functionalities and operationalisation. Remote access to digital resources was made available along with necessary support to ensure that the learning resources not available to students were provided through the inter-university lending system facilitated by the **Sir Dorabji Tata Memorial Library**.

Special provisions were made for online submission of dissertations and theses by students and research scholars on the student management system along with interface for guides to evaluate the theses/dissertations online. Guides were also able to evaluate the theses/dissertations online, thus facilitating degree

conferment for a large batch of students. Similar provisions were made for other academic submissions as well on TISSOL.

Further, each academic programme adapted their courses to the online mode. For instance, the **School of Media and Cultural Studies** had to conduct their filmmaking and production courses in the online mode, without the facility of using cameras and editing equipment in the School. Faculty members worked remotely to mentor students online and encourage the use of accessible equipment and resources to make short films as part of their course work. The students made public service announcements and short documentaries using their mobile phones. The Institute provided laptops and bore data charges to support underserved students and also reimbursed the students for hiring cameras, where required, and computers for editing films in their respective locations.

Admissions for the 2021-2022 academic year also went online with personal interviews conducted via Zoom application and with a fully in-house developed score-entry module on ERP for a foolproof and transparent marking system. Finally, the Convocation 2020, and now 2021, is being done virtually with a technology enabled platform.

COVID-19 Response

COVID-19 SUPPORT AND OUTREACH

That the COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdown has resulted in an unprecedented disruption to every aspect of life and living across the globe is an understatement.

Following the tradition of responding to disasters, TISS reached out with its multi-dimensional support including accommodating the health staff of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) in the guest house, and offering hostel space for quarantine purposes. From April to September 2020, 90 hostel rooms in the Naorji Campus at Mumbai were offered to the BMC as quarantine facility. Thirty rooms in the Guest House on the Main Campus were offered to BMC doctors, nurses and officers in April 2020, and this arrangement continues till date.

The Institute conducted two COVID-19 checkup camps in August 2020. A vaccination drive was organised in January 2021 for faculty, staff and their families.

A special issue of *The Indian Journal of Social Work* titled, "Social Work in Emergencies: Learning from the COVID-19 Pandemic" was published in April 2021. The eight articles in the Special Issue delineate the gaps in our preparedness, capacities, knowledge and skills to tackle the pandemic and suggests ways to address the gaps.

As always, our **Field Action Projects** were at the forefront of COVID interventions, some of which are highlighted below:

- **iCall** (School of Human Ecology) – the telephone based counselling helpline – ran a dedicated COVID helpline from April to December 2020 to address mental health concerns of frontline workers and attended to 3,892 calls from 29 states and union territories of India, as well as from two other countries.
- The **Special Cell for Women** (School of Social Work) reached out to over 10,000 vulnerable persons affected by the pandemic (during and after the lockdown) across various states via telephone as well as in-person. In Maharashtra, 'Mala Bolaycha Aahe' – a helpline was launched in collaboration with the Women and Child Development Commissionerate, Government of Maharashtra. Between April 2020 to March 2021, the Special Cell responded to 15,313 calls

from women asking for help to stop violence against them. The Special Cell also extended psychosocial support to 25,000 migrant workers at transit camps set up by District Collectors. In a special initiative set up by the District Collector of Latur, seven social workers of the Special Cell provided round-the-clock telephone support and counselling to 75,000 Covid patients and their family members through the District Collector's helpline.

- **Prayas** (School of Social Work), the national convener of the National Forum on Prison Reforms, intervened with a PIL on COVID Contagion and Prisons in the Supreme Court and made several suggestions to release prisoners on bail to reduce overcrowding. Prayas' advocacy with the Maharashtra Prison Department also led to prisoners being allowed to 'video call' their family members and be in contact with their lawyers via phones during the lockdown period.
- **TANDA, Udaan** and **Pragati** (all led by faculty from the School of Social Work), and **Transforming M-Ward** (School of Habitat Studies) continued their community-based relief measures including distribution of food grain packets, and other essential items and medicines in their project areas.
- The **Child Protection Fellowship Project** (School of Social Work) conducted awareness sessions on the spread of COVID-19 among children and offered psychosocial care through telephone counselling.
- **Sukoon** (School of Human Ecology) facilitated online support groups for individuals reporting relational distress and also conducted a series of workshops to build capacities of mental health professionals in addressing issues of couple and family conflicts and well-being.
- Community volunteers from **Koshish** supported people at high risk (pregnant women, new mothers, infants and children and people with terminal diseases) in Delhi and Mumbai with food and other essentials and spread correct information on the nature of COVID-19 and about

Covid vaccination. Over 2,40,000 cooked meals were provided/facilitated by Koshish over a span of six months.

The **School of Media and Cultural Studies** (TISS Mumbai) created animation videos to create awareness on COVID-19: (i) *Dealing with Disinformation and Fake News*, a set of slides and videos highlighting the pitfalls of consuming disinformation during the pandemic (English and Hindi); (ii) *Our Health in Our Hands*, a set of four informational animation videos covering preventive measures to avoid the Corona virus infection and coping strategies to deal with the lockdown (English and Hindi); and (iii) *Understanding Psycho-social Wellbeing During COVID-19*, an animation video for iCALL (In English and Hindi). All the videos were widely used in several Mumbai wards.

The **Tuljapur Off Campus** was an active partner with the District Coordination Committee providing support to five villages under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. The Off Campus also extended support to several hundred migrant labourers housed in three relief camps in Tuljapur Block by providing regular counselling sessions and ran a Counselling Helpline for COVID-19 patients and their families. The social workers, who were trained by iCALL (TISS Mumbai), handled nearly 5,000 calls. In the **Guwahati** and **Hyderabad Off Campuses**, faculty and students undertook COVID-19 related research, policy analyses and data trackers, community awareness drives and fund raising for affected population groups.

As an educational response to COVID-19, the **Centre for Excellence in Teacher Education** (CETE) reached out to teachers, teacher educators and students to cope with the challenges posed by lockdown and school closure. A wide range of high quality educational resources were created/curated and made available online in English and other Indian languages. To help teachers adapt to and build skills for technology enabled teaching-learning, a free MOOC course — COOL-Technologies for Online Learning in School Education — was launched in which more than 1,400 teachers and educators got enrolled. The COOL initiative was seeded by Tata Trusts and supported by the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission for Teachers and Teaching.

CONTRIBUTION TO NATIONAL PROGRAMMES AND POLICY MAKING

Making People and Systems “Saksham”

The **Saksham** project funded by the Global Fund since 2008 supports the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in its fight against HIV and TB. It has shaped the psychosocial support programme for HIV and Tuberculosis (TB) in the country.

Given Saksham’s convergence with the public health system, its activities continued without a single day’s break during the COVID-19 lockdown. Saksham counsellors used virtual spaces to provide continued counselling during the lockdown and took immediate and active steps to connect nearly around 1,000 migrated drug resistant (DR) TB patients to the nearest TB centre in their hometowns, thus ensuring treatment continuity. Recognising that nutrition is essential for TB patients, the Saksham Counsellors personally mobilised more than Rs. 55,60,885/- for providing food grains to the neediest patients. Overall, Saksham has now a registered total of 85,000 DR TB patients, out of which 38,000 old patients were provided with follow-up treatment during the period under review.

Saksham is also a partner in the Jan Andolan Programme – the clarion call made by the Hon’ble Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Mr. J.P. Nadda, to end TB by 2025. Saksham Pravaah Counsellors are recognised as “COVID Warriors” and have been lauded for their commitment and role during the pandemic.

Incubation Centre

The Incubation Centre at TISS is the official knowledge partner of one of the most prestigious incubation programmes — Social Innovation Immersion Programme (SIIP) of the Biotechnology Industry Assistance Council (BIRAC), Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. Under this programme, the Incubation Centre will guide and mentor 140 biotechnology start-ups from 14 Technology Incubation Centres across the country over a period of three years. The first cohort of 63 biotech innovators is nearing its successful completion despite the tough challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the selection of the next cohort is underway.

The Incubation Centre is partnering with Ministry of Tribal Affairs and the Tribal Cooperative Marketing

Development Federation of India Limited (TRIFED) to implement the Pradhan Mantri Van Dhan Yojana (PMVDY) in Maharashtra. Under this programme, the Incubation Centre will train 1,600 members of the tribal community for skill upgradation and capacity building, to develop an enterprise model based on the MFPs (Minor Forest Produces) they collect. The training will focus on sustainable harvesting/collection, primary processing and value addition, packaging and business plan development.

India Justice Report

Prayas (a field action project of the School of Social Work, TISS Mumbai) was one of the partners of the second edition of the *India Justice Report*. Released in January 2021, the Report compares and tracks the rise and fall in each state’s structural and financial capacity to deliver justice, using the latest available government figures. Supported by the Tata Trusts, Prof. Vijay Raghavan (Prayas Project Director) was on the Steering Committee of the Report and one of its authors.

National University Students’ Skill Development Programme

Between 1 June 2020 and 31 May 2021, over 200 webinars were organised by the National University Students’ Skill Development Programme (NUSSD) to help students overcome the challenges of the pandemic and develop soft-skills from the comforts of their home. Noted domain experts conducted these sessions and this effort has benefited over 4,800 students across Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Jharkhand and Rajasthan. NUSSD launched *Nayi Udaan* — an initiative to bring out the extraordinary stories of students who embarked on their career after receiving training through the NUSSD programme.

TISS signed an MoU with Schaeffler, a leading German auto-component maker to implement the NUSSD programme in Vadodara, Gujarat and Pune, Maharashtra. Under the project, 350 students were trained during 2020-2021 at Vadodara (Gujarat), and upon this successful completion, Schaeffler has decided to offer the programme in Pune (Maharashtra), as well.

COLLABORATIONS AND PARTNERSHIPS

Despite the challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic, TISS created and strengthened various partnerships.

- The Social Incubation Centre at TISS and the Incubation Forum of the Shri Govindram Seksaria Institute of Technology and Science (SGITS) announced **a joint incubation call** for enterprises with ideas to counter COVID-19.
- A joint collaboration of FICCI, TISS and Azim Premji University prepared **a policy proposal** called the Udyog Sahayak Enterprises Network or USENET, a support system to ensure ease of doing business for micro and small entrepreneurs. This is in resonance with the Institute's mission of fostering socially relevant entrepreneurship.
- As part of National University Students' Skill Development (NUSSD) programme, TISS signed an **MoU with Schaeffler**, a leading German auto-component maker for training students at Vadodara and Pune.
- TISS continued to have **strong partnerships with universities** across the world and signed 10 MoUs and agreements, including with Monash University, École Nationale d'administration Publique, Essex University, Masaryk University, The Hertie School, Badamasi Babangida University, The Open University of Tanzania, Royal University of Bhutan as well as Erasmus+ and Roskilde University. The Institute also **received a grant from UKIERI** and Study in India to conduct another virtual Customised Study in India Programme (CSIP) with University College London in Feb 2021 – this time on the theme of 'Sustainable Development'.

Schaeffler India, TISS tie up to provide skill training to graduating students in Gujarat

MUMBAI: Industrial and automotive supplier Schaeffler India has partnered with Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) to implement a National University Students' Skill Development (NUSSD) programme, for providing skill training to 350 graduating students from three colleges in Vadodra in Gujarat.

OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

TISS has a very active internationalisation programme coordinated through the Office of International Affairs, which nurtures multi-faceted and multi-disciplinary global collaboration to facilitate this.

In 2020-2021, as there was no possibility of international travel of students, TISS joined some of its partner universities in offering virtual semester exchange programmes. We welcomed three semester exchange international students from Sciences Po, Lille and from the Network on Humanitarian Action (NOHA). We also had TISS students participate virtually in semester exchanges at Macquarie University and The University of Sydney.

Additionally, 19 new full-time international students were enrolled in the Institute’s various teaching programmes online.

The first virtual Customised Study in India Programme titled ‘Introduction to Contemporary India’ for students from international partner universities and institutions ran from 30 November to 9 December 2020. Through the 7-lecture programme, students were exposed to key themes and debate relevant to present day India, including themes of diversity in India, environmental issues, public policies, gender, economy, and forced migration. The customised programme was very well-received with 31 students from 11 universities participating in it.

CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE IN CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

The vision of the Centre of Excellence in Corporate Social Responsibility (CECSR), formerly known as the National CSR Hub, is to comprehensively support public and private sectors in carrying out their CSR activities through social impact assessment of projects, knowledge creation, capacity building of various stakeholders associated with CSR, and empanelment of NGOs and CSOs. The CECSR considers the social, economic and environmental dimensions of development to be interconnected and recognises the tremendous potential in multi-stakeholder partnerships that can be leveraged through CSR initiatives to achieve positive social impact.

The CECSR has successfully implemented over 100 projects so far by working with a variety of stakeholders in the field of CSR. Being located within a community-connected university, the CECSR has the unique advantage of drawing upon the expertise of faculty and leveraging the strengths of the Institute's field-

based networks to provide high quality service and relevant, contextual and locally embedded solutions to development challenges.

During 2020-2021, the Centre was approached by 32 different companies to carry out various CSR activities in the field of research, training and capacity-building activities. Among them 13 projects with companies like the Airport Authority of India, CLP India, UTI – Asset Management Company Ltd., National Stock Exchange, Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd., Southeastern Coalfields Ltd., Hindustan Colas Pvt. Ltd., CII Foundation, Western Coalfields Ltd. and JM Financial Foundation are ongoing; the remaining 19 are at the proposal finalisation stage.

The ongoing projects are spread across different states of India and the CECSR is engaged in conducting social impact assessment, monitoring and evaluation, social auditing, baseline surveys, and rapid assessment studies.

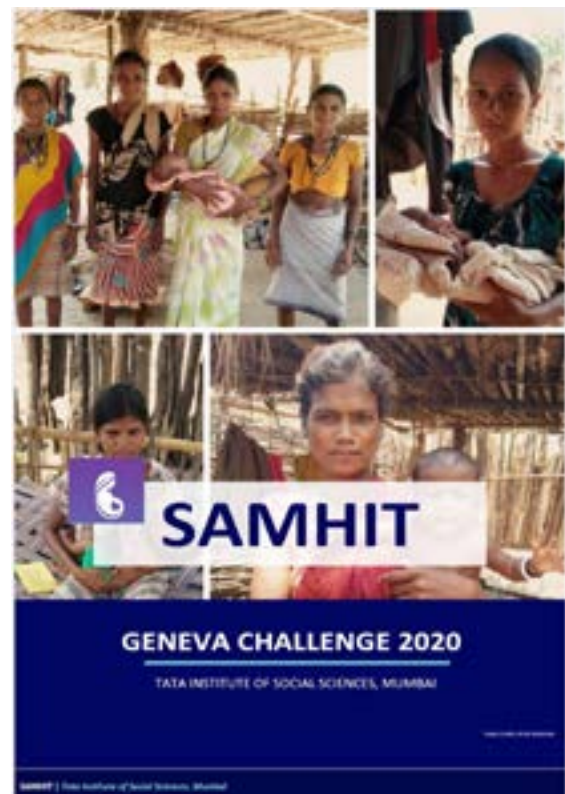
AWARDS, FELLOWSHIPS AND RECOGNITION

The students, faculty and alumni of TISS continued to make us proud.

- **TISS won Gold** in the Education Category at the second edition of the Digiplus Awards 2021. The awards recognise brilliance in digital marketing and the Gold was presented to TISS for “Big Results on a Small Budget: How TISS Achieved 14X ROAS”. The award recognises the use of creative digital marketing in advertising modular courses leading to the launch of Reflective Teaching with ICT (RTICT) as an open offering for teacher professional development.
- **Dr. Priyanka Dixit** (School of Health Systems Studies, TISS Mumbai) received the Prof. K.B. Pathak Award for best paper published in Population Studies at the 41st Annual Conference of IASP held during 28-30 November 2020. The award is given for the best paper in the field of Population and Health with significant contribution in terms of methodological innovation.
- **Dr. Bibhu Prasad Nayak** (School of Livelihoods and Development, TISS Hyderabad Off Campus) received a grant from the Norwegian Research Council for a collaborative project to study riverine rights in India, Columbia and New Zealand.
- **Dr. Himanshu Dhaka** (School of Management and Labour Studies, TISS Mumbai) received the Fetzer Institute Scholarship to attend the Management, Spirituality and Religion (MSR) programme at the 2021 Academy of Management.
- **Archana Soreng** (Batch of 2016-2018, M.A. Regulatory Policy and Governance, TISS Mumbai) was nominated to the UN Secretary-General’s Youth Advisory Group on Climate Change. This is an effort by the United Nations to bring more young leaders into decision-making and planning

processes, as the UN works to mobilise climate action as part of the COVID-19 recovery efforts.

- Four students (now alumni) of the 2018-2020 batch of the Master of Public Health in Social Epidemiology (School of Health Systems Studies, TISS Mumbai) won the Second Prize at the 2020 edition of The Geneva Challenge. The theme was to address the “challenges of social inclusion”. **Minal Madankar, Pooja Sawale, Harshal Shirodkar** and **Anukriti Chhabra**, proposed a solution for the inclusion of tribal women residing in remote parts of the country by augmenting technology in the existing maternal healthcare system. Five teams out of 150 teams were selected — one each to represent Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, and Oceania & South America — to present their project, defend answers and answer practical feasibility questions from the jury of expert representatives of academic, governmental and private sector backgrounds.

- **Charul Verma** (Batch of 2020-2022, M.A. Public Policy & Governance, TISS Hyderabad Off Campus) presented the winning research paper for ECONOVID 20/20 organised by the Centre for Advanced Studies in Policy Research, 5-7 June 2020.
 - **Debarati Choudhury** (Batch of 2020-2022, M.A. Public Policy & Governance, TISS Hyderabad Off Campus) was selected for a special mention at the Monash University Graduate Research Symposium, Australia, in October 2020 for her paper on "Violence and Resistance: Situating Agency in Higher Education".
 - Our Master's degree students in Analytics from TISS Mumbai are also winning many awards.
- Vivek Sharma, Ashwini Sanku, and Barun Kalita** secured the First Runners-up position at Analytica 2021 competition organised by SJMSOM, IIT-Bombay; **Satya Praveen Meesala** and **Shraddha Bhatia** were the First Runners-up at the Dataverse 1.0 competition organised by Shri Ram College of Commerce, Delhi; and **Shubham Singh, Arshiyaa Singh** and **Prateek Mangain** were the First Runners-up in the Case Competition organised by NoBroker.com and IIM, Rohtak.

INSTITUTIONAL RANKINGS

The Institute participated yet again for various national and international rankings such as NIRF, ARIIA, Times Higher Education-Impact Ranking, QS Asia World University Ranking, MDRA-India Today Survey of Best College and University, and Gender Advancement for Transforming Institutions (GATI).

It is a matter of pride that for the fourth year in a row, the School of Social Work of TISS Mumbai, was rated the best social work programme for the year under the MDRA-India Today College Survey.

The NIRF ranked TISS 54th overall and 34th among universities.

Under the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Ranking – which assesses universities against the United Nations’ Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) – TISS is ranked among the top 200 for SDG 8, the top 301 for SDGs 1, 2, 5, 7 and 15, and the top 400-600 for SDGs 3, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 16. These rankings indicate the Institute’s comprehensive engagement with all, but two SDGs.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

As a premier Institute in the field of Social Work and Social Sciences, TISS has a commitment to the highest standards of ethical research and practice. Research projects carried out in TISS are often with the vulnerable and marginalised sections of society and these projects are sensitive to issues of social justice and equity. Research findings have been used for field action, awareness raising, and policy advocacy at both the national and international levels on a spectrum of social, economic, and environmental issues.

The Office of the Deputy Director seeks to work towards this by anchoring Institutional Bodies (Institutional Review Board and Research Council); providing a forum for organising and disseminating of research work done by research scholars and faculty through the *TISS Working Paper Series*; collaborating with publishing houses and supporting the development of manuscripts and papers; providing facilitative support for the Direct Ph.D. Programme and the M.Phil. Programme; providing opportunities to research scholars to join the teaching and research work at the Institute; and by extending capacity-building support to research scholars so as to strengthen their research work. All this is geared towards achieving a strategic focus in terms of current research endeavours, to promote an environment that facilitates and sustains high standards in research, and to develop an agenda for future knowledge development at TISS.

Anchoring Institutional Bodies

The **Institutional Review Board** (IRB) reviews, approves and monitors all types of research proposals involving human participants with a view to safeguard the dignity, rights, safety and well-being of all actual and potential research participants. During 2020-2021, six IRB meetings were organised. Forty-two new proposals were submitted for ethical clearance of which 30 proposals were granted clearance.

The **Research Council** (RC) allocated funding to support social science research by TISS faculty on critical social challenges related to COVID-19 in 2020-2021. This call encouraged research studies which investigated COVID-19 from an inter-disciplinary and transdisciplinary perspective and 10 COVID-related research projects were sanctioned by the RC.

In addition to the COVID research projects, the RC is funding five other research projects on the themes of employability skills and library science curriculum, psychotherapy supervision, petty traders, field work supervision, and saving and credit associations in life of slum dwellers.

The Indian Journal of Social Work

During 2020-2021, four issues of the *The Indian Journal of Social Work* were uploaded, published and added to its repository and currently, it hosts 82 Volumes (325 Issues) published since January 1940 to January 2021. Thirty-six articles were published during the current year.

The IJSW is keeping up with the changing landscape of academic publishing and networking. It is indexed in SCOPUS and hence, included in Group II of UGC CARE List: <https://www.scopus.com/sourceid/29759>. It is also indexed in the Indian Citation Index (ICI) since August 2019, and is in the process of including its metadata in J-Stor.

Capacity-Building Support to Research Scholars and Faculty

Regular workshops and capacity building interventions are organised on various themes for scholars and faculty. During 2020-2021, 16 capacity-building interventions were conducted for research scholars and faculty. The capacity-building interventions are offered to all scholars irrespective of their disciplinary backgrounds.

Modular Coursework for Scholars of Direct Ph.D Programme

A key component of the work of the Research and Development Centre is to plan, coordinate and provide support to the Modular Coursework for Direct Ph.D Scholars. TISS recognises these scholars as a valuable asset to the Institute and society as they bring with them a wealth of indigenous and practice-based knowledge and skills and their research has the potential to deepen understanding of the theory-practice relationship. The first modular coursework was conducted from 11 January to 1 February 2021 and the second modular coursework was conducted from 5-26 April 2021.

FACULTY AND ACADEMICS

Research

During 2020–2021, **178** research and documentation projects were ongoing at the Institute; 65 projects were initiated in the year under review. Of these, 14 were co-anchored across different Schools/Independent Centres/Campuses.

The **School of Health Systems Studies** (TISS Mumbai) conducted a national-level study on the Mental Health Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic amongst the General Population in collaboration with Stony Brook University, New York, USA. This study makes an attempt to explore the initial mental health impact of COVID-19 among general public by using Patient Health Questionnaire (PHQ9) instrument and recommended mental health strategies during COVID-19 pandemic crisis.

Dr. Murali Krishna Mallepaku (TISS-Azim Premji School of Education, TISS Hyderabad Off Campus) is the Principal Investigator of “Lived Experiences of Migrant Workers during COVID Lockdown: A Study of Narratives of Reverse Migration from Telangana to Home States”. This study is supported by TISS Research Council and attempts to gain a deeper understanding of the migrant workers’ lived experiences and the social and economic impact of the COVID-19 lockdown.

The **Centre for Excellence in Teacher Education** (CETE) received research funding from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, National Human Rights Commission, Cognizant Foundation, Azim Premji University, Department of State Educational Research and Training, Karnataka, UNESCO, State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT), Uttar Pradesh, The Open University, UK, and Sir Dorabji Tata Trust.

Field Action Projects

There are **35** Field Action Projects (FAPs) currently active in the Institute. The projects address a wide range of issues, including violence against women, rights and rehabilitation of persons being processed by the criminal justice system and children in conflict with law, homelessness and beggary, child and adolescent mental health, access to health in rural and tribal areas, corporate social responsibility, sustainable livelihood,

food security, adult education, and health among others.

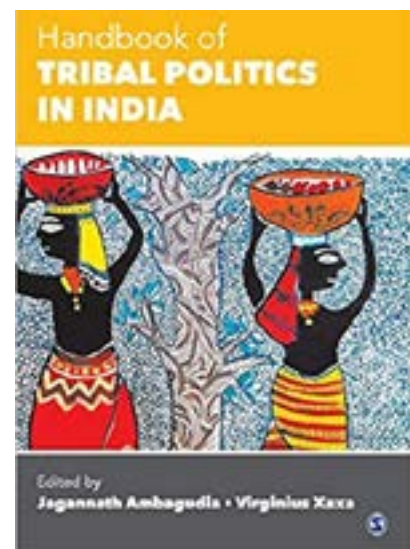
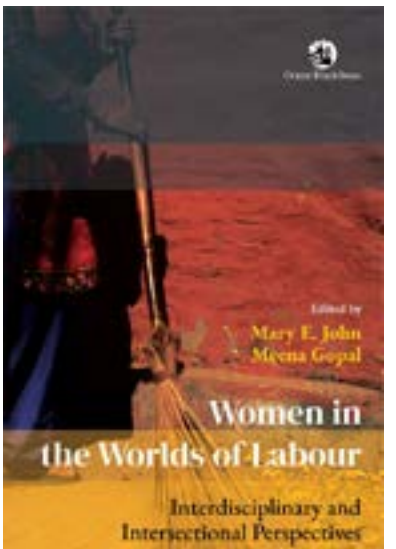
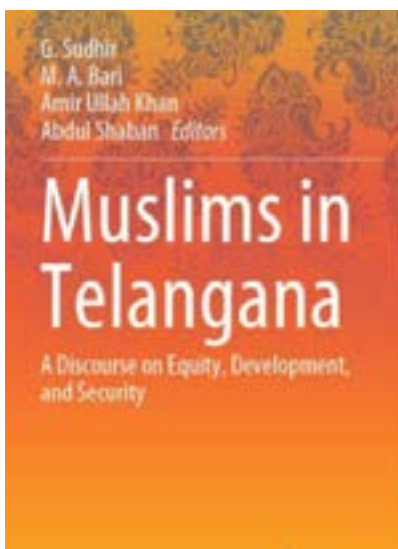
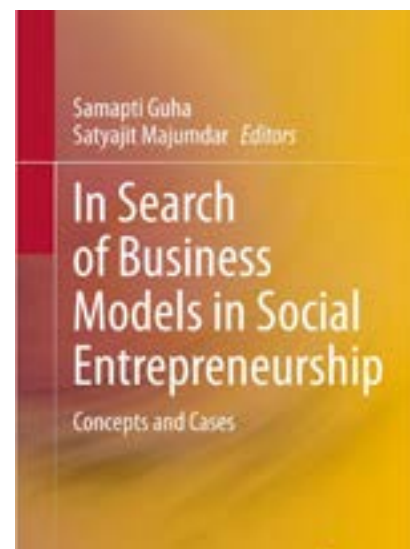
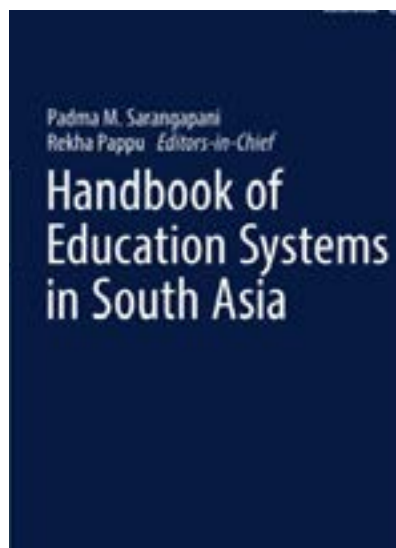
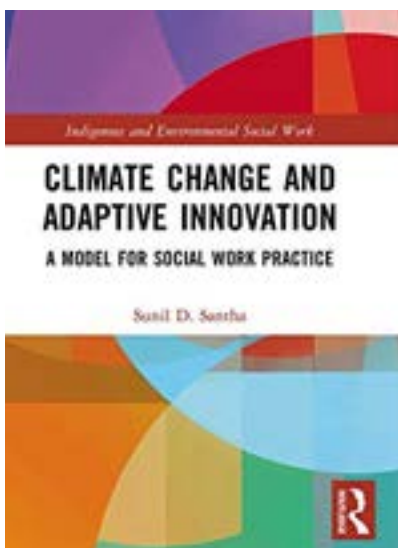
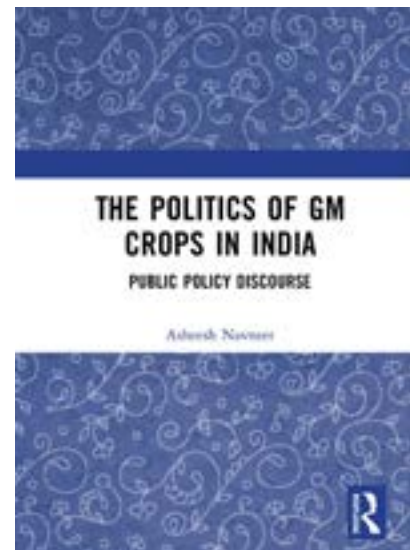
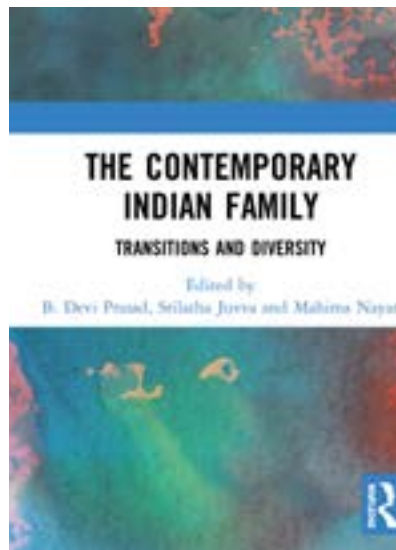
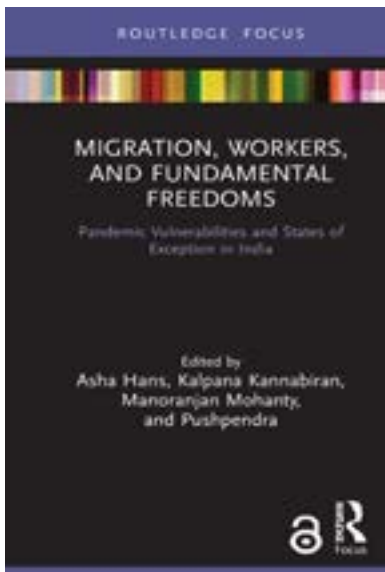
TISS faculty produced **421** publications; of these 216 as peer-reviewed journal articles, 105 as chapters in books; 28 authored/edited volumes and 74 other writings including book reviews, articles in newspapers, magazines and reports. These include publishers like Routledge, Springer Nature, Sage Publications, Orient Blackswan, OUP and Bloomsbury, and journals such as *EPW*, *The British Journal of Social Work*, *South Asian Economic Journal*, *International Journal of Governance and Public Policy Analysis*, *Journal of Migration Affairs*, *Journal of Globalisation Studies*, *Ageing International*, *International Journal of Housing Policy*, *Science, Technology and Society*, *Health Policy and Planning*, *Indian Journal of Medical Ethics*, *Integrative Psychological and Behavioral Science*, *International Journal of Manpower*, *Journal of Police and Criminal Psychology*, among others.

Our M.Phil. and Ph.D. Scholars had **62** publications in journals, books and newspapers.

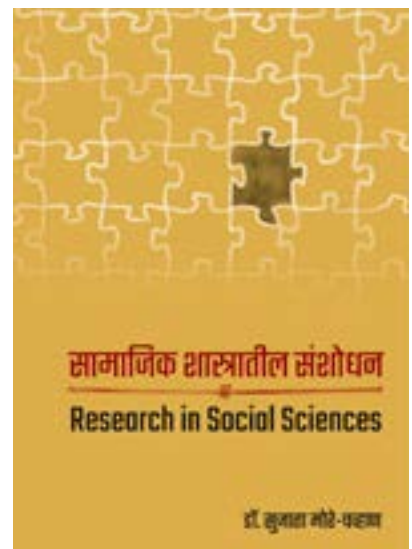
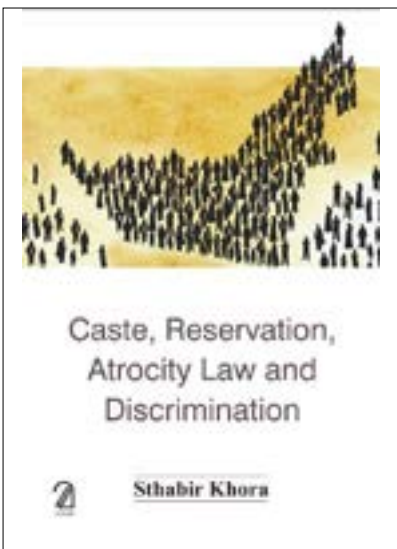
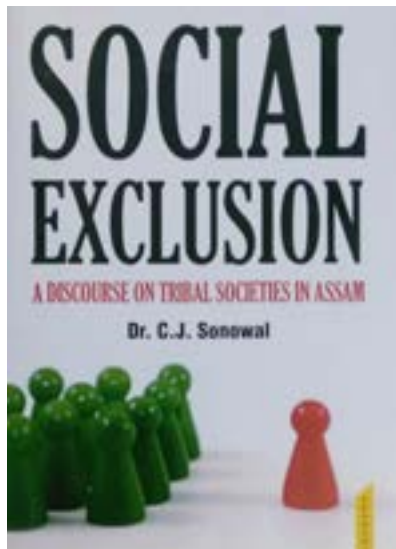
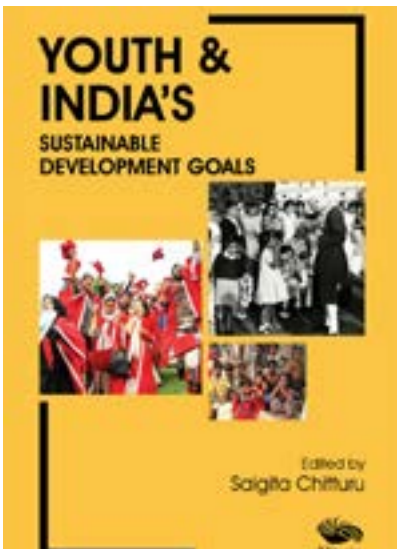
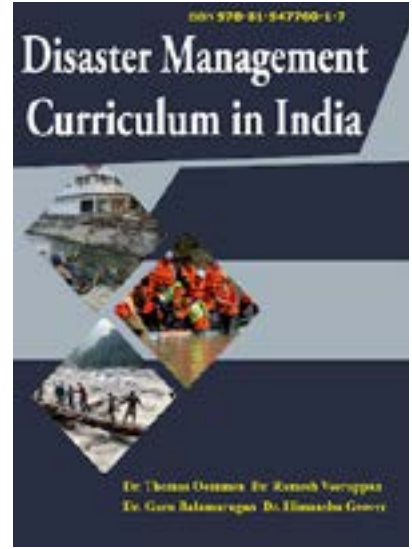
A special mention needs to be made of the ***Handbook of Education Systems in South Asia*** edited by Prof. Padma Sarangapani (CETE) and Prof. Rekha Pappu (TISS-Azim Premji School of Education, TISS Hyderabad Off Campus). It is the first work to provide a comparative analysis of education systems of countries in the South Asian region that have a shared history and culture of over 2,000 years.

A few new themes were explored like the book on ***In Search of Business Models in Social Entrepreneurship: Concepts and Cases*** edited by Prof. Samapti Guha and Prof. Satyajit Majumdar (School of Management and Labour Studies, TISS Mumbai). The book discusses different innovative business models adopted by social enterprises to bring about social change in terms of creating capabilities among the marginalised.

Faculty also produced important national guidelines. ***Counselling for Adolescents: A Learning Manual*** was developed by the iCALL team (Dr. Aparna Joshi, Ms. Tanuja Babre, Ms. Ayesha Sharma and Ms. Ritika

Kallianpur) in collaboration with UNFPA and NHM, Rajasthan. The Manual comprises seven protocols addressing themes of general counselling, and also counselling for relationship concerns, academic concerns, substance abuse, violence, sexual and reproductive health, and suicide among adolescents and young people. The protocols are intended to be brief, yet comprehensive roadmaps for counselling adolescents and young people.

Seminars, Conferences, Workshops and Training Programmes

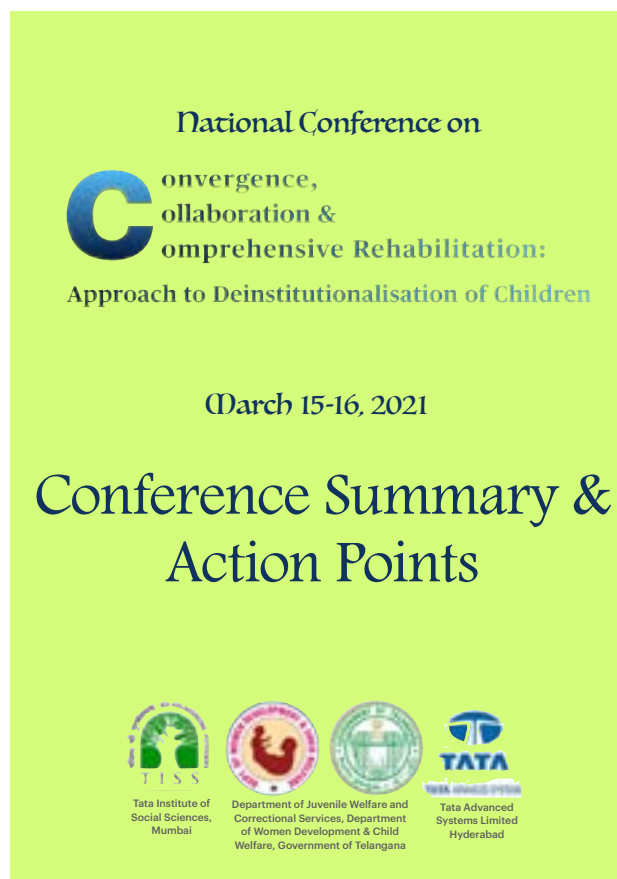
Faculty organised and participated in nearly 1,000 national and international webinars, workshops and lecture series, among others during the year – an overwhelmingly high number – on wide-ranging themes of human resources management, leadership development, climate concerns, mental health and human development, social accountability, micro-planning, statistical methods, capacity-building and development, Dalit and tribal issues, disaster management, education, health, human rights, life skills, management and organisation development, research methods, and training of trainers, among others.

The **Centre for Excellence in Education (CETE)** collaborated with the **School of Human Ecology** at TISS Mumbai to offer their Back to School programme, which was aimed at approximately 200 teachers, school counsellors and principals. This free-of-cost webinar-cum-MOOC programme ran from July to September 2020.

Educational Design 2020, the annual design thinking workshop for schools was conducted in the virtual mode from 25 September to 31 October 2020 by CETE in collaboration with the MIT team. This workshop was enabled through the support from SPARC, Gol and Tata Trusts grants. The workshop series was conducted in a blended mode with 10 synchronous sessions and asynchronous tasks wherein 24 participants (12 teams) from diverse teaching contexts across India participated in this workshop series.

The **TISS Hyderabad Off Campus** organised a virtual talk on “Girl Child Rights” by Nobel Peace Laureate Shri Kailash Satyarthi, on 3 April 2021. Shri Kailash Satyarthi is the Founder of Bachpan Bachao Andolan, Global March against Child Labour, Global Campaign for Education and Kailash Satyarthi Children’s Foundation.





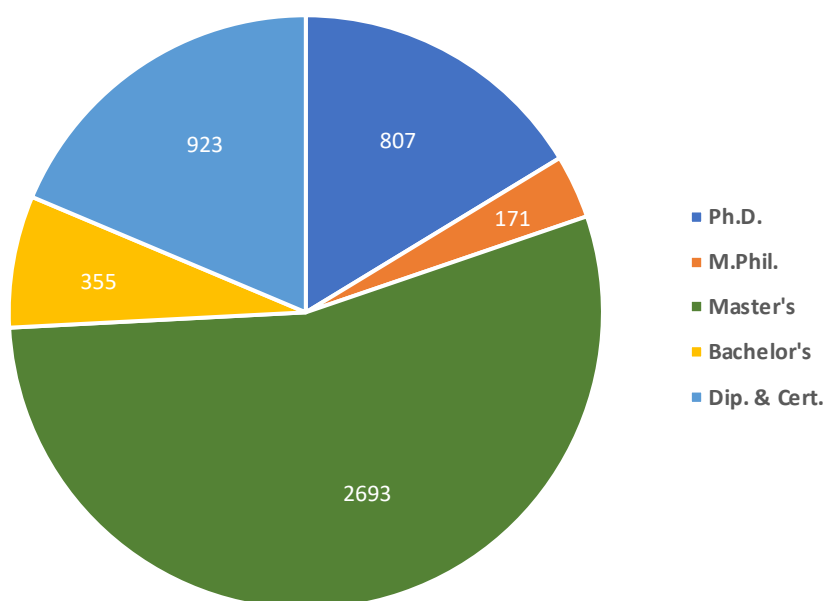
Executive Committee Memberships

In 2020-2021, the Institute's faculty served on **417** executive committees of professional bodies, governmental organisations and NGOs. These included decision-making bodies of various ministries and departments in the government, NGOs, industries and institutions, as well as UGC committees for reviewing/developing/auditing curricula, and administration of educational institutions across India.

STUDENTS

Enrollment

Student enrollment the Academic Year 2020–2021 totalled **4,949** across all campuses. This includes **355** in the Bachelor's, **2,693** in the Master's, **171** scholars in M.Phil., **807** for Ph.D., and **923** students in the Diploma and Certificate programmes across all Campuses.



Office of Students' Affairs

The Office of Students' Affairs (OSA) functions as the key institutional mechanism for linking students with the Institute administration and academic staff and structures. The OSA also serves as a focal point for processing medical insurance claims as well as providing financial aid to students from economically weaker sections across all campuses and centres.

Student Support Mechanism: As the Institute geared for an online mode of education this academic year, the OSA team started spade work on assessing the diverse needs of the student community. The OSA collated a list of students across all campuses who required support in terms of laptops and data packs. The OSA team dispatched 114 laptops and 135 data packs to students and efforts were made to reach remote places as well.

The OSA also facilitated several support mechanisms in addition to allocation of Student Aid from the Institute. Gol-PMS Scholars and economically marginalised

students were supported with a range of services to address their concerns. Over the years, the OSA has applied for several grants and raised resources for individual needy students. Through Student Aid and fellowships, financial support was provided for 570 students across campuses. The total financial support disbursed during this academic year was **INR 1,54,01,886/-**.

We are extremely grateful to Cognizant Foundation, Allana Foundation, Murthy Nayak Foundation, Taksheel and Tata Trusts for supporting our students through scholarships and financial aid. We are also grateful to several individual donors, including many from faculty, staff and alumni.

Mental Health Services: The Counselling Centre plays a key role in promoting mental health through individual and group sessions. The pandemic added to the existing stressors of students and these services were required for our students, more than ever before. The Counselling Centre conducted outreach programmes for

students as well as different groups of people. Online mediums such as the internet, social media platforms and innovative cloud-based video communication technologies like Zoom and Google Meet, along with WhatsApp were used for reaching out to students and for conducting topical programmes based on felt need. In the year under review, 466 clients were given individual counselling, and seven Facebook live sessions, 12 workshops, and four group sessions were conducted along with other developmental support activities.

Connecting to Alumni: On the occasion of the 2021 Institute Day, TISS took the opportunity to connect with our Alumni across the globe. The theme for the Institute Day was “Rewind and Unwind” and a small group of alumni from batches 1970 to 2005 came together to discuss their days in TISS. As a run-up to the Institute Day, we shared images and videos of Institute Day celebrations over the years on TISS social media

platforms. Several alumni like Mr. Sanjaya Pradhan, Ms. Archana Soreng, Mr. Jibin Jose, and Mr. Karthik Kamal Saikia, who held different positions in the Students’ Union during their time in TISS, spoke at the event. Prof. Nasreen Rustomfram and Mr. Sobins, both TISS Alumni, anchored the session. A culmination of all of these efforts was the announcement of the setting up of the Alumni Affairs Cell, with representation from faculty and alumni.

Career Development Training: In order to boost students’ readiness to face placement processes, the OSA organised a training session on “Facing Interviews and Organisations’ Expectations”. This session was conducted by TISS Alummus, Mr. Sobins Kuriakose, Head of National Skill Development Corporation. A session on “Opportunities in Studying Abroad” by TISS Alummus, Dadasaheb Tandale was also organised. The OSA also mobilised alumni connections to bring more placement opportunities for the outgoing batch.



ORGANISATION MANAGEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT

Women and Gender Development Cell and Internal Committee

As an institution of higher education, TISS is governed by the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013; and the UGC regulations on Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions, 2015. TISS also uses, as an additional guideline, the UGC-commissioned Report of The Task Force to Review the Measures for Ensuring the Safety of Women on Campuses and Programmes for Gender Sensitisation 2013, also referred to as the Saksham document.

Since this work involves both prevention and redress, TISS has 2 integrated bodies – the **Internal Committee [IC]** as mandated by these laws and policies to receive, process and redress complaints of sexual harassment, and the **Women and Gender Development Cell [WGDC]** to do the work of raising awareness on questions of gender and sexuality, advocating for respectful and anti-discriminatory gender relations, and to mainstream gender in the policies of the Institute.

The WGDC at TISS Mumbai started its activities for 2020-2021, with an orientation session for the incoming Master's students of the 2020-2022 batch. During the past year, the WGDC has been continuing its work towards making the campus a more gender-aware space for all stakeholders.

A gender-aware code for faculty and staff that was rolled out in November 2019, was further developed in an online format in 2020. The WGDC has also begun, in October 2020, efforts to build a gender policy at TISS, that will work towards making Institute policies and vocabulary more gender-inclusive, in keeping with national and international conventions. A basic document on internet protocols was generated for the student community, in the context of online coursework and meetings/webinars that have been the norm in the pandemic, in February 2021.

In keeping with the mandate of the UGC, the TISS WGDC has a student-centred **Gender Advocates programme** that follows and builds on the UGC mandate of Gender Champions to cater to the post-graduate student community. Gender Advocates are selected from among volunteers in the first year of Master's Degree programmes, and are responsible for awareness and advocacy. Currently, TISS has 21 Gender Advocates across programmes.

A campus initiative – **Campus Conversations** – has been started by WGDC in collaboration with the Association of Commonwealth Universities in December 2020. As part of this initiative, the WGDC has conducted a baseline survey on gender issues among staff, students and faculty on campus, and begun a series of workshops that will be conducted among these communities, on questions of consent, masculinities, and SH law. One of the activities of this initiative is *the Feminist Calendar Project* that is led by the Gender Advocates in collaboration with their peers, to document the unknown or lesser known histories and struggles around gender and sexuality in South Asia and elsewhere, including their impacts on education. Some of the calendars, which can be found at <https://tiss.edu/view/6/women-development-cell/campus-conversations/>, are an inspiring testament to perspectives emerging among the student community.

SC/ST and EO Cells

The primary objective of the SC/ST Cell and Equal Opportunity Cell (EO Cell) of TISS is to ensure, as mandated by law, that the reservation policy is implemented both in admission and recruitment, and that neither students, faculty members or staff of TISS are subjected to any kind of discrimination or deprivation or harassment on the basis of their social identity; in other words, for being the member of a particular caste or tribe. Some of the mandated activities that these Cells undertook during the academic year 2020-2021 are enumerated here.

Orientation Programmes: An Online Pre-Admission Orientation Programme (PAOP) was organised for SC/ST and OBC candidates who had applied for the TISS Common Entrance Test (CET) for admission to the various academic programmes being offered for the academic year beginning in 2021. In all, 206 candidates attended the PAOP held on 30-31 January 2021. A Post-Admission Orientation Programme was conducted for the students belonging to SC, ST, OBC and Minority communities on the kind of support provided by the Cell; the responsibilities of students to avail of these supports; the various government schemes available; and the eligibility criteria to avail of these schemes.

Representation in Admission and Recruitment

Panels: TISS ensures that in every admission panel or recruitment panel, there is representation of a faculty member from the SC/ST background. This is to see that every SC/ST candidate competing for admission is given a fair chance of being selected.

For admissions in the academic year 2020-2021, a total of 83 admission panels were set up across campuses, of which, 43 faculty members were from within the Institute and 40 from outside Institute. During June 2020–March 2021, the SC/ST and EO Cells nominated faculty members in as many as 12 recruitment selection panels, as mandated in the reservation rules, and as reiterated in the guidelines of the SC/ST Cell, to protect the interest of SC/ST and OBC candidates who faced interviews for the teaching/non-teaching positions.

Facilitating Students to Apply for Scholarships/

Fellowships: One of the important activities that the SC/ST and EO Cells engage on a regular basis is to

facilitate students from the reserved categories applying for various kinds of government scholarships. For the academic year 2020-2021, four senior and five junior SC students of TISS Mumbai successfully completed their application for the Top Class Education Scholarship (TCES) and are awaiting the grant. Among the senior ST students of academic year 2020-2021, five students have already received the TCES. With regard to those students for whom the Cell has facilitated the process of securing the Post Matric Scholarship, 94 belonged to SCs, 47 STs, 54 OBC (NC), 1 PWD, and five from the Minority category.

Administration

Appointments, Promotions and Retirements: There are **181** UGC sanctioned academic positions of which 158 are filled. There are also **93** Ad-hoc academic positions of which 61 positions are funded by the Tata Trusts. Of the **252** administrative positions (including Technical and Service Staff), 171 are filled. Fourteen appointments and 11 promotions were made in 2020-2021. Eleven faculty and 12 administrative staff superannuated or took voluntary retirement in 2020-2021.

At the **81st Annual Convocation** of TISS, **1,615** students and scholars will be conferred their degrees as follows.

From **TISS Mumbai**, **45** will be awarded their Doctor of Philosophy and **63** their Master of Philosophy degrees. **864** students will receive their Master's Degree, of which, **47** will be in Applied Psychology (Clinical and Counselling Practice); **215** will be in Social Work; **12** in Disaster Management; **42** in Development Studies; **25** in Women's Studies; **26** in Education; **26** in Education (Elementary); **40** in Public Health (Health Administration); **51** in Hospital Administration; **22** in Public Health (Health Policy, Economics & Finance); **26** in Public Health (Social Epidemiology); **70** in Human Resources Management and Labour Relations; **15** in Globalisation and

Labour; **23** in Social Entrepreneurship; **30** in Organisation Development, Change and Leadership; **22** in Media and Cultural Studies; **10** in Library and Information Science; **16** in Climate Change and Sustainability Studies; **21** in Regulatory Governance; **15** in Urban Policy and Governance; **15** in Water Policy and Governance; **34** in Access to Justice; **24** in Applied Psychology with specialisation in Clinical Psychology (BALM); **20** in Applied Psychology with specialisation in Counselling Psychology (BALM), and **17** in Social Work (BALM).

From **TISS Tuljapur Off Campus**, **2** will be awarded their Doctor of Philosophy and **6** their Master of Philosophy degrees. **124** students graduate with a Master's degree, of which, **27** will be in Development Policy, Planning and Practice; **39** in Social Work in

Rural Development; **27** in Social Innovations and Entrepreneurship; and **40** in Sustainable Livelihoods and Natural Resources Governance. In addition, **83** students will be awarded a Bachelor's degree: **46** in Social Sciences and **37** in Social Work with specialisation in Rural Development.

From **TISS Guwahati Off Campus**, **6** will be awarded their Doctor of Philosophy and **4** their Master of Philosophy degree. **150** students graduate with a Master's degree, including **74** in Social Work; **16** in Ecology, Environment and Sustainable Development; **18** in Labour Studies and Social Protection; **16** in Peace and Conflict Studies; and **17** in Sociology and Social Anthropology. **45** students graduate with a B.A. in

Social Sciences. **9** students graduate with a Master's in Livelihoods and Social Entrepreneurship from the **Nagaland Centre**.

From **TISS Hyderabad Off Campus**, **2** will be awarded their Doctor of Philosophy and **5** their Master of Philosophy degrees. **168** students graduate with a Master's degree, including **28** in Rural Development and Governance; **24** in Women's Studies; **16** in Natural Resources and Governance; **23** in Education; **35** in Development Studies; **21** in Public Policy and Governance; and **21** in Organisation Development, Change and Leadership. **48** students will receive their Bachelors' degrees in Social Sciences.

• To generate knowledge in the field of social work, criminology and corrections through research, documentation and analysis of field experience.

Programmes : Prayas has been working in the criminal justice system – prisons, courts, legal aid systems, shelter homes for women and children – since 1990, with the aim of protection of legal rights and rehabilitation of vulnerable and marginalised sections, through social work intervention. The intervention programmes can be summarised as follows:

1. Protection of legal rights and rehabilitation of vulnerable groups in criminal justice
2. NGO Placement Programme, a specially designed rehabilitation model for criminal justice or socially stigmatised populations
3. Advocacy of law and policy change related to legal rights and rehabilitation of marginalised groups in criminal justice through research and documentation of field experiences.
4. Organising workshops, seminars, and training programmes with stakeholders towards effective implementation of correctional laws and policies.
5. Creation of multi-stakeholder platforms at district, state and national levels towards effective coordination among government departments, agencies and civil society organisations.

Prayas is a member of various state-level committees related to prisoners' rights and rehabilitation, anti-human trafficking, rehabilitation of custodial populations and crimes against women. It is a founder member of an alliance of socio-legal initiatives in criminal justice. Prayas has recruited social work and legal fellows 2018 to work in collaboration with the district legal services authorities to strengthen access to legal aid and bail for under trial prisoners. More than 6000 under trial prisoners across 6 prisons in Maharashtra have been reached out to and more than 2000 have been released on bail through this project. Prayas as one of the co-authors of the India Justice report 2020, which was anchored by the Tata Trusts.

Despite challenges posed by the pandemic and the lockdown, Prayas reached out 1600+ families (approx. 8100 people in Maharashtra and Gujarat), by way of cash transfers, rations and psycho-social telephonic support, and continues to support them. Bank transfers worth INR 10 lakhs helped 832 families. Prayas reached out to prisons and custodial institutions through supply of sanitisers, hand wash, masks, sanitary pads, and thermal thermometers, based on requests received from the authorities.

The Government of Maharashtra has increased the budget of the grant in aid to released prisoners from 12 lacs to 1 crore for the financial year 2020-21 due to Prayas advocacy efforts. The grant amount has been increased from 5000 to 25000 per released prisoner. The sponsorship amount for children from single parent families under the Bal Sangopan Yojana has been increased from Rs. 425 per child per month to Rs. 1100 per child per month.

Prayas is the national convener of the National Forum on Prison Reforms which has intervened in the PIL on COVID Contagion and Prisons in the Supreme Court and made several suggestions to the court to release prisoners on bail to reduce overcrowding.

Prayas advocacy with the Maharashtra Prison Department led to facility of video calling for prisoners with their family members during the lockdown and also allowing phone calls with their lawyers.

- To strengthen and facilitate positive changes in the basic education facilities available for the tribal children through skills program.

- Evolving Livelihood initiatives to enhance capabilities and also to ensure availability, access and consumption of nutritional food for the people in the community.

Programmes :

- The project works on three interconnected themes. Health, Education and Livelihood (with an aim to enhance the living standards).
 1. Diversified livelihood avenues
 - a. Farm based interventions: A wide range of crops to increase productivity, nutrition as wells as income. Thus, there are range of crops that fetches income, like rice, pulses and jasmine flowers. Kitchen garden and vegetable cultivation are introduced in the recent past.
 - b. Initiated low cost and efficient irrigation mechanisms that require very limited resources. Drip Irrigation is adopted in certain areas, and setting up for flood irrigation in one pada. Also worked on local systems of water conservation mechanisms like Goni Bhandara. Water is a critical resource in the context that we work in, thus substantial attention is given for effective water conservation mechanisms.

- c. Attempts are made to promote conservation agriculture, preparation and use of organic manures, and introducing intercropping mechanisms.
 - d. Shifting the livelihood initiatives to move beyond basic subsistence to add basic assets and enhance the living standards of households in the padas.
2. Skills and Education in Tribal Schools: Pragati, has evolved a context specific skills model for the adolescents who are studying in the Ashram School. This model not only engages with children, but also with teachers and wardens. This program aims to better education opportunities for children and also their overall wellbeing. Over the two years, we can see a tremendous change amongst the children, which is visible on several parameters.
 3. Alongside the social interventions for health, we also work towards minimizing malnutrition amongst children and young women. We work closely with the primary health centre, work on creating awareness in the communities on institutional delivery, immunization for children and take part in all community-based health initiatives.

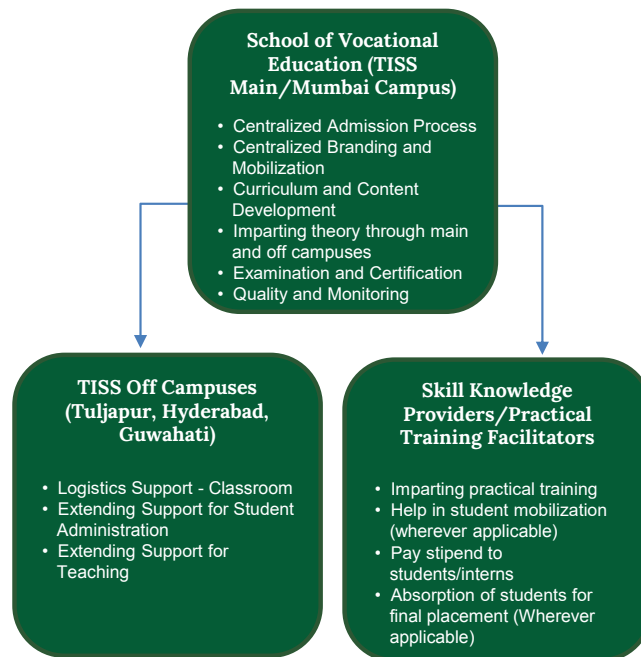

The **School of Vocational Education** was set up to impart skill education to millions of Indian youth through appropriately designed vocational education programmes.

The focus is on developing job-specific skills rather than providing only a broad knowledge based education. The approach adopted is called the Internship

Embedded Skill Training Programme during which many students may also earn a modest stipend in select skill knowledge sectors. The aim of this 'Earn while you learn' model is to enable the students to learn the skill by engaging in an internship on the shop floor of the industry/company along with theory training in the classroom.

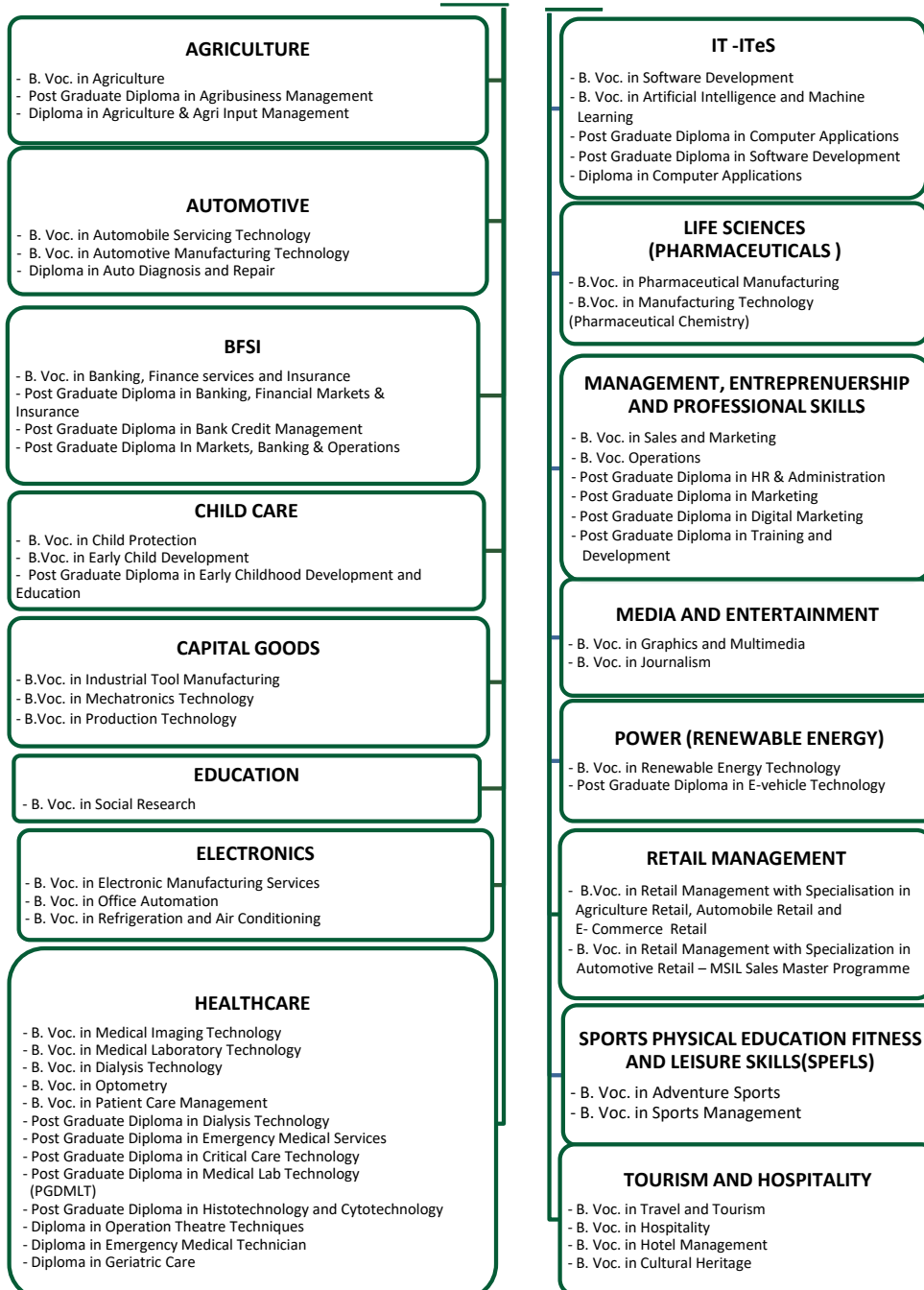
SVE MODEL



TISS-SVE currently offers 34 Bachelor of Vocation programmes conforming to UGC norms. Arranged level wise, the 3-year degree programmes begin with a Diploma course leading to a Bachelor of Vocational Degree (B. Voc.) in the third year. Every individual level/year is a stand alone certification recognised and awarded by TISS. These programmes allow the students who have passed Standard 12 or have done SSC+2 Years of ITI, to directly join the National Skills

Qualifications Framework (Level 5) based on their academic achievements. The undergraduate courses of the B. Voc. programme incorporate specific job roles and their equivalent National Occupational Standards (along with broad-based general education) The graduates of the programme are equipped to meaningfully participate in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment, or becoming entrepreneurs.
