Historicising Modern Maharashtra: Beyond Dominant Frames

Addressing sexuality related debates during the early half of the 20th century in Maharashtra, the talk would focus on contextualizing the idea of modern Maharashtra, the problem of the dominant frames of analysis and issues related to sexuality and popular sex talk in Maharashtra.



Shrikant Botre is a doctoral scholar at the Department of History, University of Warwick, UK. With an MA in History from the University of Pune, his work centres around 'Sexual Modernity in Western India 1920-1960.'

He is currently researching on a manuscript "Understanding R.D. Karve: Brahmacharya, Modernity, and the Appropriation of Global Sexual Science in Western India, 1927-1953, with Douglas E. Haynes; and working on two research papers: "R.D. Karve and Male Middle-Class Sexuality in Western India: Correspondence Published in Samaj Swasthya, 1927-53", also with Douglas Haynes; and "Sexual knowledge and the question of 'Authority': Marie Stopes's India Correspondence (1920 to 1950)."
